

TABORA CLEAN WATER TRUST OCTOBER 2010

Tabora Clean Water Trust is UK Charity working in partnership with HAPO www.hapotabora.net in Tabora Tanzania.

Our first 3 projects are finished:

1. The safe toilet and bathing cubicle built in collaboration with a granny and her family in Kiloleni, Tabora Tanzania. The toilet is connect to a ventilated pit that was dug out and lined with brick and cement plastering. Bathing water is directed towards the vegetable garden behind the toilet and does not enter the pit. <http://www.hapotabora.net/Projects/TaboraCleanWaterTrustInst1.html>



2. Clay lined water filter buckets for distribution among low income families around Tabora. See right, Deus Ntiruka TCWT Project Leader seen here with the water filters (which prevent some diseases) prior to distribution. Phase 2 of this project is now complete.

Phase 3 will involve the purchase of more water filters in November for distribution to newly identified low income families. The water filters will be purchased from the pottery run by blind potters in Tabora. Provision of these filters, and the servicing those already distributed will be phased according to funding available for this project.

3. The Survey of the Water and Sanitation facilities of low income families in Tabora is now complete. The results reveal great difficulty obtaining water and hazardous sanitation facilities and the data is being prepared for publication on the website.

New projects in the planning stage:

1. The building of a 3 metre diameter rain water collection tank in collaboration with a low income family in Kiloleni, Tabora to provide all their water needs in the rainy season and drinking water in the dry season.
2. The purchase of a plot of land for rehousing some families from multiple occupancy rented accommodation where it has not been possible to provide improved water or sanitation installations at their current homes and the family is seeking to enjoy better water or sanitation facilities in a new location.
3. Providing 60 litre water storage containers with lids to families who would find it a relief to collect water for two days when the piped water is flowing and could reduce or eliminate long treks to a pond on days when piped water does not flow. Piped water in Tabora flows, at best, for 4 hours every second day.
4. A dedicated Tabora Clean Water Trust website will be launched in December 2010 with the help of a volunteer.
5. An application has been sent to the UK Charity Commission in order to register the Tabora Clean Water Trust. Registration will assist in the really major task of raising funds to carry out our work. In the meantime we are reliant of your generous donation which have enabled us to act to reduce hardship and prevent disease.
